Other Services

Fast Track Training Program

Participants have access to non-credit, shortterm training courses which last seven to fifteen weeks. They can also complete state or national certification examinations, if applicable.

Employer Networking Opportunities

Employer Networking Opportunities are mini job expos open only to Fast-Track Training participants. Three to six employers hiring in the specific training area meet, interview and potentially hire participants.

Job Readiness Training Academy

Job seekers get soft skills training in human resources related issues such as dependability and reliability, adaptability/flexibility, motivation, integrity, handling workplace conflicts and interpersonal skills. Participating employers share career ladders offering upward mobility in their industry as well as identify "job-ready" candidates with the possibility of immediate employment.

Third-party funding information and referrals - serves as the initial point of contact for providing funding information and referrals to individuals seeking financial assistance through third-party funding agencies.

Literacy/Educational Enhancement

Participants receive instruction in reading, math, and comprehension to enhance their likelihood of successful completion of the GED exam. Instructional model incorporates both classroom and computerized instruction.

Employment Connection Partner

A collaborative workforce system of the Cuyahoga County and City of Cleveland Departments of Workforce Development, the Employment Connection assists with the specific needs of both job seekers and employers.
